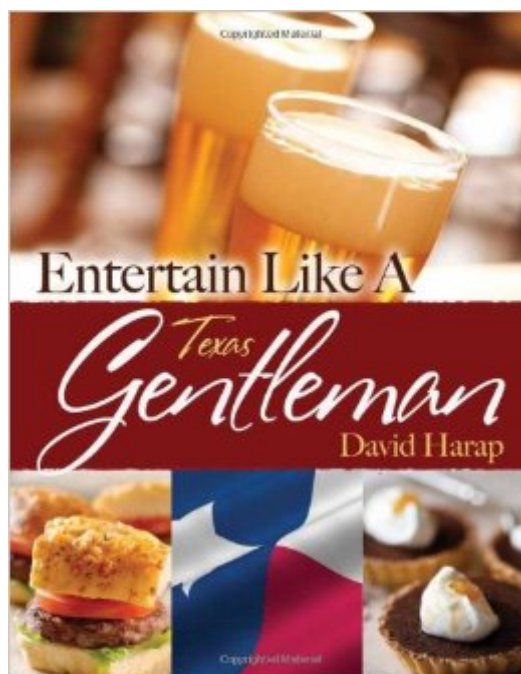

best pudding I've ever had! No more store-bought for us! And the kids loved making it! Quality time AND quality food! One of the things I really liked about this book is that it has a shopping list on its own page so you could easily copy it and bring with you. It also gives you the equipment you'll need. There's nothing worse than getting halfway through a recipe before you realize you don't have something you need! It's so nice when it's provided for you instead of having to make your own lists. There is room for "Culinary Notes" at the end of each section which I also appreciated. Sometimes I write right on the page of a recipe but this is much better!
