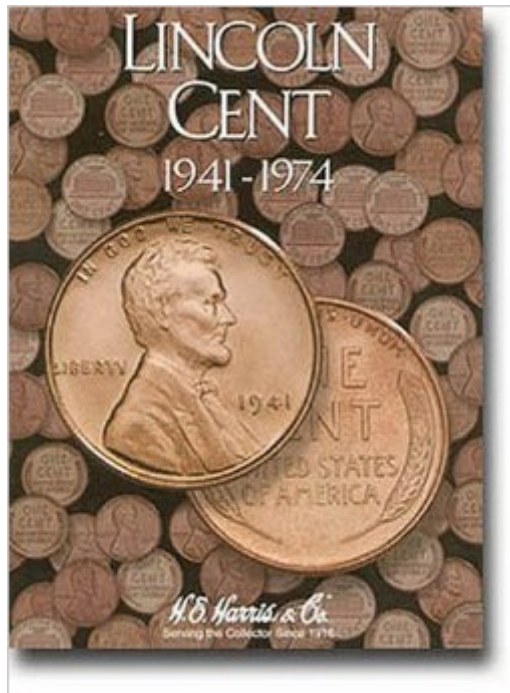

I bought these for my grandkids to keep them entertained and busy for a weeklong stay at my house. The twins are 7 years old and the other is 8. I had this huge jar of pennies and placed them all into a large bowl for them to pull out, one at a time, and place into one of the slots in these cool little collectors books. I was worried they would not have fun doing it and that they would revert back to less social video games. Just the opposite happened. They spent hours going back to the kitchen table looking for pennies to put into their books. There was a lot of social interaction too when one of them found a penny they already had placed in their book, they asked other kids if they needed it. It was a great social family experience for everyone and it helped hone their skill with numbers because needed to find the dates on the folders. This is a good experience for grandparent to do with their grandkids and the product is perfect and of great quality. I can easily recommend this product to my fellow shoppers who are looking for a coin collection book.

Ordered this to replace a hand-me-down penny folder that was starting to fall apart due to age. For some reason it's a lot easier to get the pennies secured in their slots like the 1975-2013 folder I also ordered some time ago. But as long as they don't fall out of their slots (and so far they haven't) I'm

fine with it. If you're looking to get into collecting, there should still be more than a few "Wheaties" floating around, along with a lot of pre-'82 copper pennies in circulation. Don't expect to find 1940s pennies unless you get really lucky though.

I can't say enough about the H. E. Harris coin books. Our family has had so much fun collecting and filling them up. They have provided a great activity that allows us to teach our kids how to count and search for different markings on the coins. Once we fill them up I will buy more so we can start all over again.

This folder was also difficult to get the coins in but not as hard as a Whitman's folder. As careful as I was I did rip one of the slots and very few coins went all the way in. At least they have not fallen out so far. I will stick with Littleton's folders. They are easy to use, coins pop right in and never fall out. I would not recommend this folder.

The backing is weak and the penny's push through if you aren't careful. Moving the penny's in and out of their slots quickly damages the material. These books don't quite suit my needs, as they were purchased for my 5 year old son. I can't recommend them for young, amateur collectors.

The coins go in easily without tearing up the folder. Coins stay in put and don't go flying out when you open or close the folder. The coins are easy to get out if you really need to get them out. The folder is sturdy, and won't get the corners dented in (at least with proper storage). Over all, I'll rate this folder a 5 out of 5. I'm satisfied with the product.

Bought for the kids to get excited about collecting something. It worked out well. Every few months after saving all our loose change we make a night of it, after a while, finding a coin we need is a big deal.

I used to put old pennies in a plastic bag away from the 1980+ and just have them all mixed there. Buying this has really organized it and now I know which dates I need. The coins fit well with a like push and the feel of the book is good. I would recommend this to anyone who has a lot of pennies laying around.
