

OK, so these books are basically canonical lists of all the coins on the planet. In tribute, I will say a few words in canonical list format.1. Do not, under any circumstances, pay list price for these things. It has been my experience that your local library book sale is probably giving these away for a dollar. Since they're reference guides, libraries turn these over every single year. Don't pay \$50 when you can get them for \$1 at the annual booksale. They'll be a year out of date but who cares.2. Remember, the prices listed here are RETAIL prices. If you take your collection to the coin shop to sell it you'll get ... well, not the prices listed.3. These don't change all that much from year to year

and when they do it's generally to reflect a change in the price of gold or silver.

The 'Standard Catalog' series is the foundation of coin identification and values for coinage from 1600 to the present. It's not perfect, but it is the best there is for now. Even though these publications are also available on compact disk, many collectors, myself included, find it easier to the book, even if it is quite massive! The series are usually updated every year, but even the older editions are very helpful, especially since they are heavily discounted. Needless to say, the values are almost always out of date, but do give you an idea of comparative scarcity.

Gee folks - For the best prices most all current values, you must try these used catalogs! They are clean like new at phenomenal savings. Sometimes even the profits are recycledback into the libraries where they had originated. If you are avid or a novice they are of course easy and efficient to use. What a relief it is to know and actually taste the knowledge. Attribute your coins dates and inscriptions by sight or comparisons.
