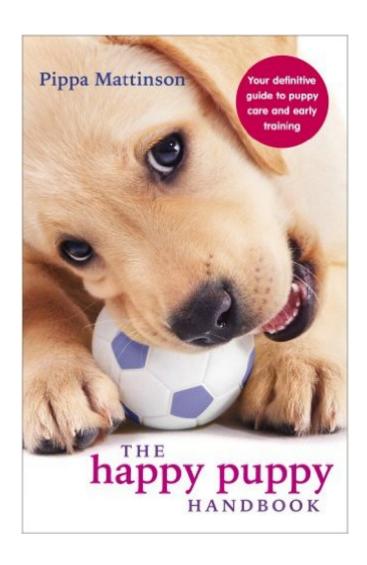
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The Happy Puppy Handbook: Your Definitive Guide To Puppy Care And Early Training

This is a superb guide to positive training for your puppy. The advice parallels what I've learned from working with several professional trainers, but the book explains things so clearly and is always there as a reference for me. The subjects are well organized and it covered everything we needed to know bringing home our new lab puppy. He's now almost 5 months and a joy to live with. Everything in this book worked for us.

Has some great tips, my pups liked it too, as they tried to eat it, LOL!! I have had German Shepherds and Rottweiler's, mostly rescues. In my younger years, we bred German Shepherd's so I'm not new to puppy training, however, I got these pups at eight weeks old, so I did not have them from birth and that makes a major difference, by eight weeks, if not properly handled, they can develop issues. I found this book helpful, I believe in positive training, which this reference book also uses. I do recommend it for new puppy owners, along with common sense, love and patience.

This book saved our lives. One lesson though. Prepare to get no sleep the first 2-3 days your puppy comes home & have help with the pup. I swaddled mine in a fleecy fabric, sung lullables, and fed him in the crate all day to make sure he felt safe in it. Now, four weeks later he goes bouncing into it with glee. Patience, kindness & perseverance.

Great book!!! If you like thelabradorsite, this book has all the information that is on that site put into a logical order. I wasn't sure if I'd need this book too after reading that site in depth, but I have found it quite helpful. I really like all the background the book gives on why puppies behave the way they do. It really helps me to understand how to best bond, nurture and train my new puppy. I suggest this book for all new and prospective puppy owners. I would say it is best to read this book well in advance of brining your new puppy home, but I believe it is still quite helpful (to you and your new addition) to read at any point during your puppy's young life.

This book is an all-in-one guide to puppydom, from preparing to bring your puppy home to helping your puppy become a healthy and happy member of your family. I think that most questions that a new puppy parent would want to ask are covered in this book (e.g. where should my puppy sleep? why does my puppy bite so much and what do I do? can I let my puppy off the lead? what do puppies need to eat and how often?). It is really practical. It is also an easy, engaging read. The language is totally accessible - everything is clearly explained and it's written in a warm, friendly style. The author is also realistic in preparing new owners for all the perplexing and trying things that puppies might get up to and in giving great advice to head problems off at the pass before they arise (through good preparation) or through to help owners use a training solution. The training advice in the book covers all the important aspects of good doggie behaviour, including recall, walking on a loose lead, being gentle and playing nicely. All this advice is based on contemporary 'positive motivational' approaches to training (using rewards). Even if you have never trained a dog before you will find it all clearly explained and easy to grasp and follow. I wish I had had this book when I

first got a puppy over 15 years ago.
